President Rtn. Sanjay Bhatia welcomed Chief Guest, Dr. Amit Mukerji, Director Ottobock HealthCare India, Mumbai. The President informed that December is designated as Disease Prevention and Treatment month in Rotary which includes disability empowerment. Regarding the International Day of Disabled Persons, held on 03 December 2020 he thanked Dr. P.J. Singh, MD of Tynor for the support we got from him for this event.

PP Dr. V.J.S. Vohra, thanked President Sanjay for giving him the opportunity to take the meeting forward. He also thanked AG Dr. Rita Kalra, who treated the patients during the pandemic, for the wonderful invocation, 'Muje dar nahi lagta', to inspire the disabled persons. Dr. Vohra welcomed his dear friend Dr. Amit Mukerji on the virtual platform. Last time Dr. Amit addressed us in a physical meeting on 23rd September 2011 when he spoke about artificial intelligence, and he even showed us the memento he was presented in that meeting! Other Clinicians present from Ottobock were Roman Jagota, Sikha Shukla and Amandeep Kaur. Senior Prosthetic Clinician PP Rtn. Vinod Bhanti and PP Rtn. Bijay Srivastava of Rotary Club of Patna also joined us.



Dr. Vohra also acknowledged the presence of MD of Tynor Dr. P.J. Singh, Sr. Prosthetist Dr. Amit Gulati of Happy Feet Prosthetic Clinic, Mohali and another Prosthetist, Dr. Narendra Kumar of D.S. Prosthetic Clinic, Panchkula.

The chief guest was formally introduced by PP Rtn. Amarjit Singh. A senior Prosthetic Orthotic Clinician, Dr. Amit Mukerji is Director of Ottobock HealthCare India, Mumbai. He is also one of the Directors of Ottobock Lanka which he helped in setting up. He completed his graduation in 1980 in Prosthetics & Orthotics from All India Institute of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation, Mumbai. He has number of scientific paper presentations to his credit on upper and lower artificial limb systems. He had various important assignments in the field of Prosthetics & Orthotics in India and abroad. Since 1998 he is working with Otto Bock HealthCare India Pvt Ltd., which is a highly reputed German company having its establishments all over the world, and are the global leaders in prosthetics and orthotics. Ottobock also has its prosthetic clinics in number of cities throughout India including in Mohali, Chandigarh.

Dr. Amit Mukerji greeted all present with, "Namaskar to everybody and good evening. I would like to thank Rotary Chandigarh Midtown and specially Dr. Vohra for requesting me to speak on this issue, which I could not refuse because of our long relationship." He gave his candid views about the disability day - 3rd December, as it is good to keep a day for the people with challenges or disabilities. But efforts should be that every day of our lives we look at it in the same way and not just keep one day special for them. He added, "It is important that whatever energy and commitment we show on 3rd December should be spread on all 365 days so that for what we are trained and supposed to do, we do justice to that and we can rehabilitate the disabled in a much better way."

Dr. Mukerji gave a very interesting and an inspiring audio visual presentation on Superhumans, with a message to work for empowerment and access to all!

Invocation by AG Rtn. Dr. Rita Kalra dedicated to Disabled Persons

He said, "The patient is central to all professionals and also affect our personal lives." Over the years we have learnt to be good listeners to understand the needs of the patient. It is Empathy and not Sympathy. Limbs don't grow back – relationships are for life. The prosthetist has a big responsibility to give correct/appropriate prescription and manage expectations of the patients. It is the patient who has to be in the forefront and because of them the clinicians exist. Patient's aspirations have to be understood and they be given a patient hearing, only then they can be provided best solutions which is most suitable for them. In India we always try to sympathize with the disabled persons that it is the misfortune by the act of God, which is wrong. It is very important that the disabled patient should not be looked down upon and that we are doing them a favour or doing some charity. There is a personal life long relationship between the prosthetist and the patient because the Limb is not going to grow and the patient has to come back to the prosthetist and for this reason trust has to be built with the patient.

Dr. Mukerji presented touching real life stories of few of the large number of Superhumans. Ottobock has worked together shaping their lives and destiny. Dr. Roshan Shaikh with above knee and below knee amputations due to a train accident, was denied admission to MBBS and post-graduation due to disability but she fought with archaic government rules to get admission. Now she is a third year resident of MD pathology. This is disability empowerment and also women empowerment. Dr. Mukerji said women can change the world. Let's support especially disabled women to become mobile, independent and give them a voice.

Paul Varghese with above knee amputation, having grafted skin on the stump, would get frequent wounds. He became India's first single stage major limb osseointegration patient. This is a direct connection between human bone and the artificial limb which involves implanting a metal anchor directly to the bone of an amputated limb that extends out of the residual limb. The prosthesis is then attached to the metal extension. This procedure enabled Paul to increase from 100 steps a day to 10,000 steps a day after the surgery. It took him 15 years to walk without a stick! In some patients progress in prosthetics may be slow, and there could be ups and downs. But progress it is!

A superhuman related to Rotary Chandigarh Midtown was also presented by Dr. Mukerji by showing detailed prosthetic treatment of Dr. Vohra's patient, Kulvinder Singh, a 15 year old boy, having four limb amputation due to electric shocks while offering kar sewa at Gurudwara in Derabasi (near Chandigarh). He was provided Myo-facil prosthesis and a cosmetic prosthesis for his bilateral below elbow amputation. Now he is walking with bilateral below knee artificial legs and carrying on his daily activities independently with prosthetic devices provided with support from Ms. Sukhy Randhawa Ransdhawa of UK, Rotary Chandigarh Midtown and Ottobock. This shows that technology can make future bright for people with disabilities. Let's make it available for them.

Dr. Mukerji concluded, "The future is digital. Treatment and delivery of treatment will change dramatically. Digital technology will transform Patient data capture, place of fabrication and place of service delivery. It will throw challenges about new skills required and new training needs." He ended his presentation with an amazing video on the digitalization in the field of Prosthetics and orthotics. We are living in the 21st century and the whole world is taking a Digital Leap. Ottobock is now combining digital revolution and humanity to provide mobility and independence. Sr. Prosthetic Clinician from Patna PP Rtn. Dr. Vinod Bhanti complimented Dr. Amit Mukerji for his wonderful presentation. He congratulated PP Dr. Vohra for his late father Col. D.S. Vohra's contribution in prosthetic technology in India. He said with Nevedac, Ottobock and Tynor, Chandigarh has become a hub for prosthetic and orthotics and congratulated Rotary Chandigarh Midtown for being part of this great achievement. President Sanjay Bhatia raised a query regarding elderly people for their safety, which generated a vibrant discussion with Dr. Mukerji, Dr. Bhanti and Dr. P.J. Singh. They suggested certain solutions like well padded garments, balloons (like in cars) and other safety devices of good quality for the elderly persons. After this there was discussion on foot ailments which was taken up by Dr. Amit Gulati, who gave valuable suggestions for foot orthotic treatment.




