2. Use your skills and expertise to serve a community.

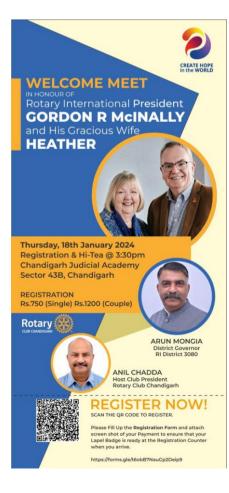
3. Practice your profession with integrity, and inspire others to behave ethically through your words and actions.

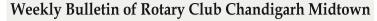
