

Signature Project of Rotary Club Chandigarh Midtown - Singhpura Elementry School Trandsormation

About School : -Government Elementary and Primary School Singhpura is located in village Singhpura which is 500 metre from Sighpura Gate on Chandigarh Ambala -Delhi Highway . This School has got LKG having 29 students (Boys and Girls) as well as UKG – school is 40 (boys and girls). In addition to this school is up to 5 th class with a total strength of 250 students. Presently this school has one Head Teacher and 7 teachers . Enrollment may increase up to minimum 100 more students after completion of additional required Rooms.

Existing Infra structure in school: - Presently school has got two small rooms along with small kitchen for making Midday meal for students and another two rooms adjacent to these were declared unsafe PWD and had been demolished few moths back. Two big rooms recently constructed are also existing. Only 4 toilets are existing for all students and Staff of school.

Adoption of School: GES, Singhpura was adopted by Rotary Club Chandigarh Midtown from PSEB, Mohali for providing required infra all structure and other facilities in order to make this school as Smart School. In lieu of this proposal for construction, Renovation, addition and alterations at Government Primary School, Singh pura was prepared in consultation with I/C of School and submitted to SEB, Mohali during March, 2023 and got approval from them in April, 23 with MOU to be signed between school and Rotary club to do all Maintenance and up keep of components after completion of construction of Infra structures by school. We have included Construction of 3 new Class Room with Verandah in front of class rooms, Headmaster cum Staff Room with Toilet, New Kitchen Store, Multipurpose Shed 50x 30 for serving mid day meal. holding school function etc, Renovation of 2 Rooms and 4 toilets, increase height of retaining wall to 8 feet, Water cooler and Hand wash station incl shed, Chowkidar hut with kitchen, provision of play items for children etc



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JUDICIARY: THE BACKBONE OF INDIAN CONSTITUTION

75th year of Indian Republic

Judiciary is the watchdog of the Constitution, its values and morality. Also of the Parliament and the Executive. Judges have to reason out truth from falsehood. Judiciary is also manned by human beings. As also the other two organs. The role of judiciary is different. Therefore, the judicial human fabric matters the most. Its strength strengthens the other two organs. Consequently, the whole nation.

We have career judges. We have lawyer judges. We do not have in India jurist judges. I hasten to add, we do have judge jurists. Many have contributed richly to the growth and development of constitutional jurisprudence. From Mukherjea to Chandrachud (Jr.). Through their judgments. Their writings. Their talks. The catalog is reasonably long. The rich contribution of Indian Supreme Court as also of Indian judges is well known and recognized. In different parts of the globe.

It would be relevant to share an interesting situation. A conflict had arisen between the UP Legislative Assembly and the Allahabad High Court. The President of India made a reference to the SC under Article 143 for its opinion in 1964. The matter came up before a bench of seven judges. The SC pronounced its opinion. In short, the writ petition could be entertained under Article 32 or 226. The judicial review could be exercised. The legislature was not immune from the jurisdiction of the constitutional courts. This was applauded by the public at large. The opinion of the Supreme Court seems to have been sent to the senior judges in UK and the US by Prime Minister Lal Bahadur Shastri. The then Chief Justice of India, P.B.Gajendragadkar received a letter from Lord Denning praising the opinion. Denning also expressed that if similar question arises before his court, he would have the courage to take the same view. Similar compliments were received from Earl Warren, the Chief Justice of Supreme Court of United States. The opinion was appreciated by several other Judges. It must be applauded that the then Prime Minister had the courage to demonstrate to the other advanced countries, the role that the Indian Judiciary had played in a Constitutional Parliamentary Democracy. This happened when the Indian Constitution was only 14 years old. We have come a long way during the last 60 years. Indian Judiciary holds the place of pride in the comity of nations.

The Basic Structure concept and doing of Complete Justice have become exportable items for other growing democracies. The top court has given constitutional voice to constitutional silences of the Indian constitution.

The appointment of Judges to the Supreme Court and the High Courts has been an issue of serious concern. I would like to share some situations. They speak of good health of Indian Judiciary. In fact, healthy traditions, I have culled them from the autobiography of Chief justice P.B. Gajendragadkar: To The Best of My Memory. He was elevated as a Judge of the Supreme Court in January 1957. He was keen that on the bench of the Supreme Court, there should be a judge directly from the Bar. He talked to the chief justice and other judges. It took sometime. Chief Justice B.P.Sinha liked the suggestion. Attempts were made to persuade H.M.Seervai, Nani Palkhivala and Lal Narayan from Patna. They all refused. The idea was not dropped. Gajendragadkar suggested to Sinha the name of S.M.Sikri, Advocate General, Punjab. A message was sent to Sikri to meet Sinha at his residence. Gajendragadkar was also present. Sikri did not know the purpose, why he had been called? He was told to join them on the Bench. The response of Sikri was: No, Chief Justice, I do not think, I would be able to do the work of a Supreme Court Judge. I do not have the making of a good judge. Sinha told him, we have decided to recommend your name. We will not take 'no' from you. Sikri said, alright, but please remember, you are taking a risk. This is how, Sikri became a Judge of the Supreme Court. In due course of time, he

The question is, why judges appoint judges? The answer is two fold. Why make an exception in the case of Judges alone? Every other appointment is made by their own peers. Including the appointment of CDS, COAS and other Army Generals. Secondly, the objectivity level which is possible in the Judiciary is not possible anywhere else. Moreover, the government is the largest litigant. Many matters are sensitive. The consequences are serious. The Public Interest and National Interest are paramount. This is the reason, why such matters go before Constitutional Benches of five, seven and nine Judges.

India had the Presidency of G20. The Summit 2023 took place in India in September. Matter of pride. The image of India has risen high. Globally. Let us not forget the contribution of the Indian judiciary. During the last 75 years of Indian Constitution, the Judiciary has strengthened the Constitutional Democracy in India. We must take legitimate pride in the Indian Constitutional Democracy. India is providing the leadership to other democracies.

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Know The First Four Rotarians




The first four Rotarians. From left: Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, Hiram E. Shorey, Paul P. Harris.On 23 February 1905, Paul P. Harris, Gustavus Loehr, Silvester Schiele, and Hiram E.
