

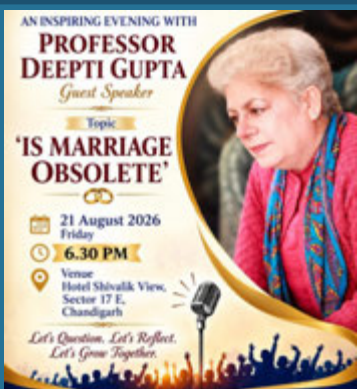

The story conveyed a simple yet powerful message: "Red eyes reflect anger and a fighting spirit, while white eyes represent peace, clarity and self-control." The children enthusiastically repeated the pledge: "Never have red eyes; always keep white eyes." The session encouraged them to choose patience, peace and positive thinking in their daily lives.
