



### Rotary & Blood Bank Society Resource Centre

PRIP Rtn R.K. Saboo invited the Rotarians of Chandigarh tricity to Rotary & Blood Bank Society Resource Centre, Dakshin Marg, Sector 37, Chandigarh on 13th Sept. 2006. He said, though Rotary Club of Chandigarh may be the implementer of the Project with Blood Bank Society but it is the Rotary family of the tri-city that can claim the sense of belonging for the very important project. It was necessary for the club leaders to get acquainted with this state-of-theart blood banking service centre.

There were large number of Rotarians present at the Rotary & Blood Bank Society Resource Centre. PRIP Rtn. Raja Saboo was himself present there to 'Lead The Way' and to introduce the Rotarians to the dedicated functionaries and the professional team of doctors of the centre. It was a very satisfying feeling to see how deeply Rotary is involved in the blood donation movement, specially when Chandigarh tricity is having sophisticated health care facilities.

PRIP Rtn. Raja Saboo told the Rotarians of the Chandigarh tri-city that this blood bank needs contributions in the form of voluntary blood donation. He suggested to hold blood donation camps in the suitable areas for which all assistance would be made available by Rotary & Blood Bank Society Resource Centre.
