Sports in India Need an Overhaul

We had three shooting champions of India in our weekly meeting of May 16, 2008, the two guest speakers, Harisharan Singh and Sukhmanpreet Singh Sidhu, and our own Rtn Kanwarjit Singh Ghuman.

PP Rtn Pallav Mukherjee introduced the guest speakers and kept the audience interested by giving some facts of the Olympics, and traced the origin of shooting from the pre-stone-age era.

Mr. Harisharan Singh, popularly known as Channi,

started his sport of shooting from the young age of 16 years. An uncle who was in the Army motivated him to take up this sport and encouraged him to improve his shooting skills.

Mr. Sukhmanpreet Singh Sidhu, started his shooting carrier young and went on to achieve remarkable places in the national and international events.

Both of them excel in .22 skeet and

air rifle events. They practice at an average, 5-6 hours a day. The sport is costly and they spend about Rs. Three thousand every month. Harisharan says that their results in the nationals and internationals are better than their results in the Olympics. This may be due to the pressure that the Olympics build on the participants.

He said that the Indian performance in the Olympics has been poor. Our score, in Olympics, is only sixteen medals in twenty nine Olympics, and eight of them in the game of field hockey. It is a pity, he added, that we are a populous country and do not have even one gold medal in the individual athletic events. Something is wrong and let us first find out what is wrong and then find ways and means to correct that wrong. Most of us blame the Government or the administrative bodies dealing with the sports. This is only partly true. Money does play a part but it is not the end-all and be-all. There is, probably, some deficiency in our psyche or in our genes or in our schooling that keeps

us so low in the performance of sports and athletics. One thing is certain that Indian parents, mostly, do not encourage their children to excel in sports even when the child is showing some promise. There is more emphasis on academic achievements than on the sports skills. This is due to the large population and very few opportunities of career and professional growth.

The two shooters have founded an organization, Playsports, to promote sports and sports events and entertainment events. Their first major event was the Akali vs Congress cricket match as a fund raising event in support of the sports competitions of the challenged persons. Both the events were great hits and got good exposure on the electronic media.

The debate-cum-discussion will focus on finding ways and means to put India amongst the major contenders in all team sports as well as in individual events and games. 
