# Paediatric Dentistry- Is it Child's Play?

Time: 6.30. PM

Our guest speaker for the meeting was Dr. Sumeet Rajpal BDS, MDS (Paediatric Dentistry), introduced to the audience by AG Rtn. R.K. Goyal. Dr. Sumeet, who is a consultant to The Apollo Clinics Chandigarh and Cosmo Hospital, Mohali, read a paper titled "Paediatric Dentistry-Is it a Child's Play?". The presentation was aimed at enlightening the fellow Rotarians about the youngest branch of dentistry- Pedodontics, which deals with the dental problems and their treatments in children.

In his presentation, Dr. Sumeet emphasied on the need to protect and save milk teeth in children. He told us about the importance of milk teeth and their role in the development of permanent teeth and jaws.

During the course of his presentation, Dr. Sumeet schematically presented the role of Paediatric Dentist in modifying the behavior of children towards dentistry and how a trained paediatric dentist is able to handle uncooperative children as well as children with special needs. Dr. Sumeet, who himself has done a course in Conscious Sedation from UK, also informed us about the role and importance of sedation in handling difficult children in Dental OPD.

Nursing Bottle Caries which affects young children and is now spreading around the world like an epidemic, was discussed in detail by Dr. Sumeet. He shared his views on the causes of this disease and the ways to prevent it. He also informed us about the treatment modalities and the materials available for children who are afflicted by this severe form of cavities in the mouth.

Dr. Sumeet revealed that children also require root canal treatment and how they are done painlessly by a paediatric dentist and these root canal treated teeth are followed by



stainless steel crowns in child patients. He also stressed the need for preventive orthodontics with simple appliances in chilren who have habits like thumb-sucking, mouth breathing and night grinding of teeth. Some appliances aptly called "space maintainers" are given to patients who have early loss of milk teeth due to trauma and extractions to maintain space for permanent teeth till they erupt. He expressed that by using such simple appliances we can reduce the need of braces in children.

Before concluding his talk, Dr.Sumeet shared his views on the most common problem in toddlers, i.e. accidental trauma to the teeth. He revealed that with proper handling and timely intervention by a paediatric dentist, even teeth which are knocked out of the socket can be fitted back and these teeth can serve a life time.

A formal Vote of Thanks was proposed by Pres. Saroj Jhawar.

Almost two hundred patients were examined for eyesight problems. Ten of them had high blood sugar & two of the patients are slated for an eye operation next week.


# Meet John Kenny - Programe Finalised

All members are requested to attend the camp in large nos. to provide their much needed encouragement & support to this important project of our Club.


