## Rotaract Recruits 25 New Members



Rotary's commitment to youth was evident from the earliest days of the formation of the International Association of Rotary Clubs.

By the early sixties Rotary International had formed a committee of five Rotarians, one each from Asia, Europe, Latin America, North America and Southwest Pacific, who developed Interact, a service club for youth in the age of 14-18 years, modeled on Rotary, with a teacher and a Rotarian as advisors.

As this concept grew in popularity, Rotary noticed a gap in the chain of service. Rotary's answer to this was Rotaract. It was designed for youth between the ages of 18-30 years who desired to serve their community, the needy, with high degree of commitment and ethical standard and seeking fellowship with like-minded, but who did not yet qualify for membership of Rotary.

It is with this same level of dedication and commitment that the Rotaract Club of Chandigarh Midtown operates. After the loss of several members who graduated as Engineers from the Chandigarh College of Engineering and Technology, they went about a recruitment drive on Saturday, August 28, 2010.

Preparations began several weeks prior to the event when President Shivender Parmar and Secretary Anchit Walia exploited their own talent and those of the remaining members, raising funds by teaching "Robotics" at St. Kabir's Public School. With the funds they raised, they approached fellow Midtowner Lalit Azad to print a brochure including an application form for Rotaract Membership. These were sold to prospective members. For one, it was a wise decision for long term return. Secondly, by selling them they made a statement - "good things do not come cheap".

They were in a quandary where to hold their recruitment drive, when the parent Club through their Sergeant-at-Arms PP Indrajeet Sengupta came to their rescue. "Banga Bhavan", in Sector 35 was booked cheaply.

The recruitment drive was publicized through posters and through club's FB page. Neha Chopra, District Rotaract Representative, Ruchika Sharma, IPP of the Club, and Varun Jain, a working professional and an IIMA student were invited to conduct the interview and two rounds of group discussions before selecting twenty-five of the sixty who applied. Even those who could not qualify, highly appreciated the high standards of the interview and GD's.

Those selected are from SGGs Khalsa College, Sector 26; S.V.I.E.T., Banur; Rayat College; I.E.T. Bhaddal; CCET, Sector 26.

You will get to meet these bright young men and women on Friday, September 17, 2010 at their installation in our regular Club meeting.

## Article 370 – Should it be abrogated?



Mr. P.C. Dogra was introduced by PP Pallav Mukherjee as an ex-Army officer, who joined the Indian Police Service with vast experience both in the Police and BSF. He spent a majority of his service years in Jammu & Kashmir, which qualified him to articulate on the subject. On 26th of October 1947, when the state was attacked by the Pakistani regular and tribal forces, Maharaja Hari Singh sought the help of India and signed an instrument of accession to India, similar to the ones signed by the rulers of other states.

However, the official Indian position was that the people of the state of J&K acting through the constituent Assembly was to first endorse the accession to India and then determine the constitution of the state and the jurisdiction of the Union of India. The Security Council's Resolution of 1948 to hold a plebiscite was an additional factor. Jawahar Lal Nehru's affinity for the land of his ancestors was a determining factor for temporary transitional insertion of Article 370 till the accession was ratified by the Constituent Assembly.

It ordained that no law enacted by the Govt of India would apply to till approved by the State Legislature or

the Governor during the President's rule. It has had no chance of revocation. This provision has been misused by the ruling political elite for building their empires, without the provisions of wealth tax, urban land ceiling act, the gift tax applying under article 370. There is a dual citizenship. Indians are not automatically the citizens of J&K. The state has separate constitution, separate flag. It was and is a clever strategy to keep the state away from the national mainstream. This suffocates the very idea of India. It keeps alive the unwholesome legacy of two nation theory. It has been misused to build a political oligarchy. And though there has been a dilution in the provisions of this Article both politically and constitutionally, yet for the healthy uniformity in the nation he felt that it should be abrogated.

The formal vote of thanks was delivered by Amarjit Singh, Joint Secretary.

## ARC Shaju at the Membership Seminar of 3070

Each summer thousands of young people are selected to attend Rotary-sponsored leadership camps or seminars in the United States, Australia, Canada, India, France, Argentina, Korea and numerous other countries.


