Stem Cells - The future of Medicine

In our club meeting on March 15, 2013 Mr. Neeraj Prashar, MSc. (Microbiology), Expansion Head, Stemade Biotech Pvt. Ltd., was the Chief Guest. He was introduced by Rtn. Brij Gulati. Neeraj, who was assisted by his colleague Ranbir Rana, came out with the importance of stem cells which could have the potential to treat several diseases, such as Diabetes and Parkinson's, Muscular Dystrophy etc.

Stem cell research is directed towards curing or preventing a

host of fatal conditions and diseases.

Trillions of dollars are being invested in stem cell research across the world and results are encouraging. He explained in details, about stem cells; what they are, how they could be used to treat disease and injury and that they are future of medicine. A cell is the basic unit of the human body, which grow and divide to form various organs of the body. Self-regeneration is the ability of stem cells to divide and produce more stem cells.

Though in the early years, bone marrow was the sole source of stem cells, however, with time, a number of other sources have emerged. Stem Cells are those master cells of the body that can



be transformed into any other cell of the body. Neeraj said, "We are for the first time thinking of 'cure' in true sense for most of our life threatening ailments."

One can bank their dental pulp stem cells in a Dental Stem Cell Bank, which is a facility that stores stem cells derived from teeth for future use. Stem cell samples are stored specifically for the use by the individual person from whom such cells have been collected. The sample can be later retrieved by the individual for therapeutic purposes. Neeraj explained the complete procedure of how stem cells can be stored and preserved.

Rtn. Prof. Dr. I.S. Dua expressed gratitude on behalf of our club and thanked Mr. Neeraj Prashar for a very knowledgeable power point presentation on the subject which may soon revolutionize the practice of medicine.


