### Financial Planning - Shifting Paradigms

Time: 7.00 p.m.

In our regular meeting on September 13, 2013, President Deepak Sood welcomed our Chief Guest Mr. Vipul Thakkar, Head of Investment Advisory Division, Principal Retirement Advisors Pvt. Ltd., Mumbai, who gave a talk on 'Financial Planning - Shifting Paradigms'. He was introduced by PP Gurdip S. Deep as a CFA Charter holder and a MBA with 9 years of rich multi jurisdictional experience in product development and management, retirement financial planning, investment advisory and channel management in asset and wealth management industry. He was accompanied by Mr. Sushil Parashar, Regional Director, Principal Retirement Advisors Pvt. Ltd., Chandigarh and his colleagues. President Deepak also referred to a quote by Ralph Marston, "What you do today can improve all your tomorrows."

In his presentation Vipul Thakkar explained, "In the good old days there was lower life expectancy and smaller retirement phase. Necessities of life did not cost us a fortune. As a result savings rate were higher. Joint family a n d most

importantly, children acted as safety net in old age. Pension from employers was mostly sufficient."

New realities cannot be ignored. Vipul compared the previous generation with new generation. He said earlier the working span was 42 years, 18 to 60, and the retirement span was 7 years, 60 to 67. But now the working span is reduced to 30 years, 25 to 55, and retirement span is increased to 22 years, 55 to 77.

Increase in cost of living and inflationary pressures are now a reality of life! People are improving lifestyles with increasing income level. Use of credit is no longer a taboo. Household borrowings (loans, credit cards etc.) are up 8 times in the previous decade.

Vipul also talked of nuclear families. Average no. of children per household is going down. Grown-up children are not staying with their parents, who can no longer depend on children for support in old age.

There is no formal pension scheme for most Indians. Out of India's total workforce of 451 million, over 84% of workforce has none or inadequate retirement savings. Therefore one needs to have a well prepared retirement plan.

There is a great need for planning due to various reasons like increased life expectancy, early retirement, no social security, improving lifestyle & its cost, increase in borrowing, nuclearisation of families and rise in cost of living. We need to identify our financial goals. Analyze if our investments are in line with our risk appetite. Investments should be sufficient and available when we need it. We also have to consider the impact of inflation and taxes on our investments. We should be prepared for contingencies and unforeseen events.

Vipul expressed great concern about coping financially in retirement. About 50% people are not worried about financial hardships during retirement. He elaborated, "You are not better off than the previous generation. Indians are most optimistic but is it backed by conviction?" Retirement preparedness of the people is very necessary.

For a happy retirement you should have a good financial planning, keep physically fit, avoid stress, do work you enjoy and have religious faith.

Vipul adviced that an investment plan should start at an early age, understand the importance of asset allocation, have a contingency fund, buy adequate health insurance and critical illness cover, buy adequate term life cover and draft a will. He concluded, "Most importantly, don't delay ... act now."

On behalf of our club, Rtn. Sanjay Bhatia thanked Mr. Vipul Thakkar for giving us an interesting presentation, which will be useful for the young as well as senior Rotarians.



### Interactive Session with Dainik Bhaskar by President and Secretary



District Seminar on Membership Development will be held on September 29, 2013 at Saharanpur. Registration charges upto 20 September is Rs. 600/- (single) and Rs 1100/- (couple). From 21-25 September it will be Rs. 700/- (single) and Rs 1300/- (couple), and it will remain the same for spot registration, but without kit.

## Know your project Water and Sanitation Project in Nepal

Project Chair: Rtn. Arjan Singh

The project addresses the need to provide clean water and sanitation to a remote and impoverished Tamang village in Eastern Nepal. The village consists of 500 scattered small holdings and is dependent upon subsistence agriculture. It is a one day drive from Kathmandu.

At present, water is obtained from a distant river system. The project plans to construct a 5,000 litre water tank on the hillside above the village which will be supplied with water from the river and from which water will be piped to the homes in the village. Around 500 homes and 4,000 villagers will benefit from

a reliable and safe water supply.

Only 150 of the 500 homes in the village currently enjoy any form of sanitation. The project will equip 25 homes and families with bio-gas toilets. These toilets will provide healthy sanitation and will provide methane gas for cooking.

Rotary Club of Patan, Nepal will assist with all the administrative requirements that are needed to implement the project. Rotary Club of Wollaton Park, UK is supporting this project which would cost US \$ 13150. Rotary Club of Chandigarh Midtown is associated with this project with a commitment to contribute US \$ 2000.
