Suicide and substance abuse among Adolescent

In our regular meeting on November 22, 2013 President Rtn. Deepak Sood welcomed the Chief Guest, Dr. B.S. Chavan Professor & Head, Department of Psychiatry, Govt. Medical College and Hospital, Sector 32, Chandigarh. The President also acknowledged the presence of Mrs. Raminder, daughter of Rtn. Mrs. D.K. Singh.

PP Rtn. Dr. V.J.S. Vohra introduced Dr. Chavan, who is also Joint Director. Regional Institute for Mentally Handicapped, Sector 32, Chandigarh. He has done MD, MNAMS, FIMSA and DHM. He is Secretary General

of Indian Association of Social Psychiatry, HOD Human Genetics Centre, GMCH, Member Secretary, Chandigarh Mental Health Authority, Nodal Officer, State Resource Centre, Nodal Officer, National Trust, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Govt of India, HOD, Centre of Excellence and HOD. Mental Health Institute. He has also received an award from President of India.

Dr. Chavan said, "It is a pleasure to be here and share with Rotarians what my department is doing, because you all are doing wonderful work for the community." He gave an informative presentation on a sensitive issue, 'Suicide and substance abuse among Adolescent'.

Dr. Chavan discussed the major public mental health issues like substance abuse, untreated depression and other mental disorders, Stress, adjustment problems at home and place of work, high rate of suicide, issues related to children and adolescents and marital disharmony. He showed deep concern about drug and alcohol abuse among the adolescents. On this issue he explained the increase prevalence, early age of onset, transition to harder drugs, injectable drug abuse with risk of HIV and AIDS, hepatitis, drug and alcohol abuse among girls and easy availability of substance and money.

Presenting the facts and figures of drug and alcohol abuse among adolescents, Dr. Chavan said, "We selected 280 students

from six different colleges of Chandigarh who never used alcohol, used once and multiple users. 42% youngsters around 18 years of age experimented with alcohol, 68% had pleasurable effect, and 54.80% expressed the desire to quit. Youngsters who wanted to continue were having someone using alcohol in the family or were experiencing stress." Steps to be taken should be early recognition and intervention, create awareness among the youth, coping strategies to handle stress, education system should focus on moral teaching, recreation and sports and also availability of school counselor. Dr. Chavan also advocated Legislation to delay first use and harmonization.

Dr. Chavan said that family members and community try to cope up by working with the person, extending all help, are supportive and do not reject them. The individuals try to cope up on their own and refuse to take help from family and community. Explaining the feasibility of home based detoxification, he talked about 37 patients of alcohol dependence who were provided treatment at home. 86.5% were successfully detoxified at home and approximately 75%, 54% and 49% were abstinent at 1 month, 2 months and 3 months respectively.

Dr. Chavan said, "In 2003, there were 130 suicides in Chandigarh and we tried to study the causes. 59.4% suicide victims were in the age group of 20-29 years. 57.4% were males. About 58% were migrant and staying in the periphery of Chandigarh. 72.2% committed suicide by hanging. 57.5% showed behavioral changes, but family failed to identify the

Talking about stress and suicidal ideas in adolescent students, Dr. Chavan said, "2402 students of class VII to XII were studied from 10 schools. About 45% students reported psychological problems. Approximately 9% students reported that life was a burden. 6 percent students reported suicidal ideas and 8 students (0.39%) reported suicidal attempt." He also discussed suicide prevention helpline, working with the media not to glamorize suicide and to hike up security at preferred places like the Sukhna lake. These actions have resulted in decline of suicides during the past 8 years.




Intercity on TRF at Ambala on Sunday, 1st Dec. 2013

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


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
