Customs and Traditions of Indian Army

On May 23, 2014 Rtn. Maj. Gen. R.S. Chopra (Retd.) gave an impressive presentation on 'Customs and Traditions of Indian Army'. He was introduced by Rtn. Maj. Gen. Hardev Singh. Born in an army family, Gen. Chopra had done his higher secondary from Air Force Central School, New Delhi. After six months in St. Stephens College Delhi, he joined National Defence Academy in

Jan 1972. He was commissioned into the Regiment of Artillery from the Indian Military Academy, Dehra Dun in Dec. 1975. In the Army career spanning 36 years, he held a large number of command and staff appointments. He was Instructor at School of Artillery for two tenures. He is an Alumni of Defence Services Staff College, Wellington. He commanded his Regiment in intense Counter

Insurgency Environment in the Kashmir Valley from April 1997 to May 1999. He was awarded 'Mention in Despatches' for gallantry. He was selected for the Higher Command Course in May 1999. He was posted in the Perspective Planning Branch of Army Headquarters for three years. After that he commanded an Infantry Brigade as part of The Strike Corps in the Deserts, and then he was Brigadier General Staff of a Corps HQ in Punjab/Jammu Border. He took over a Mountain Division in Sikkim on the India-Tibet border in high altitude in 2009. Posted as Chief of Staff of The Desert Corps in 2010 from where he retired in Dec. 2011. He was awarded VSM (Vishisht Seva Medal) in Jan 2012. He joined Rotary Club Chandigarh Midtown in Feb 2014. Happily married to Renu, they have two sons. The elder one is well settled in UK, and was recently blessed with twin sons. The younger one has followed the family tradition and is a Captain in the same regiment as his father.

President Deepak Sood acknowledged the presence of the guests, Col. Dr. Paramjit Singh and Lt. Col. Dr. Charanjit Kaur, eldest sister of R'ann Indu Vohra and R'ann Renu Chopra.

In his talk, supported by a PowerPoint presentation, Maj. Gen. R.S. Chopra gave background of the Indian army and explained how the army is structured. He said, "Our army has the fighting arms; which includes the Infantry, the Armoured corps, and the Artillery; supported by the Engineers and Signals. Customs and traditions remain with the fighting arms." It is the legacy that has been taken from the Britishers. This keeps the regiment together and gives them the will to fight. It motivates the troops to go to the battle in a situation of life and death.

Gen. Chopra gave examples of customs and traditions of five units which are region or religion based : the Sikh Regiment, Special Forces, Assam Regiment, the Gurkhas and Madras Regiment.

The soldiers in Sikh regiment are recruited from Punjab and they are very strict about their religion. The officers may be from other states but they too try to follow the Sikh religion to the extent that a non-sikh Commanding Officer and other officers would wear turbans during the exercise, battle or ceremonious functions. Following the traditions keeps the officers and their troops bonded together.

Special Forces of the Indian Army are a mixed lot. They are tough and mentally strong. They are given specialized training to carrying out special operations, and also specialize in counter terrorism operations. They operate in small teams and do not wait for orders but act on their own, are very aggressive in their approach. As a tradition they never march. They double up!

Assam Regiment is unique. Boys are recruited from the 7 states in the North East. They have a tradition of salutation of words of 'Tagda raho' for addressing each other and the officers. They eat anything that moves. They are very innovative and can lay very good traps. They are excellent people.

There are 7 regiments of Gurkhas in the Indian army, each having 5 to 6 battalions. Majority of them are from Nepal and some from Indian domicile. They are very loyal and humble troops. The kukri is part of their uniform or whatever dress they wear. They have more or less similar names. So they have a tradition of being identified by the last two digits of their army number.

In Madras Regiment the recruitment is from four states of South India – Karnataka, Kerala, Tamilnadu and Andhra. Namaskaran is the word they use. They are also excellent people and very innovative. Gen. Chopra told us about their pongal and onam which he enjoyed celebrating with them. They are known as thambis which means younger brother.

Coming to the Officers Mess, Gen. Chopra said it is an Institute in which all officers are its members. Ladies too go to the mess, when invited. Dress code has to be followed very rigidly. There are dinner nights and officers are trained in table manners. The mess staff is also trained to serve the officers in properly. The JCOs (Junior Commissioned Officers) have their own mess and do not go to Officers Mess except on special occasion like Republic Day when they are called for drinks and snacks. Officers do go to JCO mess but on Independence Day it is a special occasion for officers to go to JCO mess.

Gen. Chopra said the prestigious place in the unit is the Quarter Guard where all arms and ammunition is kept. This place is

guarded 24x7 and the young officer is the duty officer present there. The trophies, the roll of honour, people who have lost their lives in battle are listed there. Any visiting officer coming to the unit goes to the Quarter Guard and takes the salute there. Retreat and Reville are sounded by the bugle. The tradition is to remember the persons who have lost their lives in battle.

Other things explained by Gen. Chopra was Mandir parade, a term used for the mandir, gurudwara, mosque or church to cater for the spiritual needs of the men to boost up their morale. Family Welfare Centre is for interaction between the ladies of the officers, JCOs and other ranks where the problems get resolved. Even health issues are discussed. Commanding Officer's wife, being the first lady of the unit initiates these welfare schemes.

Under Operation Sadbhavna, a people friendly program, vocational training is given, goodwill schools, medical camps and facilities are provided for ameliorating the sufferings of the people and carrying out socio-economic development.

Another important task taken by the army is to provide aid to civil

authorities when natural disaster takes place, like the army provided yeoman services for the devastating floods and landslides in Utrakhland.

There are some touchy issues that the army and other services are facing. One rank One Pension for defence personnel is going on since very long. Previous Govt. had announced that they will give it but it has not been done and the veterans are very upset about this. Gen. Chopra hoped that the new Govt. may implement the one rank-one pension scheme.

Talking about war memorial or respect for the army, Gen. Chopra narrated the story of Subedar Umrao Singh who was awarded the Victoria Cross (VC) by Britishers for fighting off repeated attacks made on his section by the Japanese during the Arakan advance in December 1944. Unfortunately, in India gallantry award winners do not get public recognition as they do in many other countries where many honours are bequeathed on heroes. In India the soldiers are not respected as it is done in other countries.

Army has its own way of honouring their personnel when units
