Master plan of Chandigarh

In our regular meeting on July 24, 2015 Chief Guest Mrs. Sumit Kaur, former Chief Architect of Chandigarh was welcomed by President Rtn. Mrs. Kanan Diwan. She was introduced by PP Rtn. Gurdip S. Deep. Having done her schooling in Carmel Convent, Chandigarh, she did B.Arch from Chandigarh College of Architecture in 1977. In 1979 she joined Delhi Development Authority as Assistant Architect. In 1981 she joined Department of Architecture, Punjab. Being on

deputation with Chandigarh Administration she was Chief Architect from 1st October 2008 to 31st October 2014. She has been bestowed with the awards and appreciations by the State of Punjab and Chandigarh Administration for her meritorious service and commendable contributions for various projects and achievements.

Mrs. Sumit Kaur gave an interesting visual presentation on 'Master plan of Chandigarh'. The Master Plan of UT Chandigarh covers an area of approximately 114 sq km. This includes the nearly fully developed 70 sq km of the area planned by Le Corbusier and his team and the 44 sq km of its 3% share of the 16 km periphery controlled area. The 44 sq km periphery area of Chandigarh is regulated by the Punjab New Periphery Control Act, 1952 with the exception of the abadi deh of the villages falling within it namely

Sarangpur, Khudda Ali Sher, Khudda Jassu, Khudda Lahora, Maloya, Dadumajra, Palsora, Kajheri, Raipur Kalan, Raipur Khurd, Behlana, Hallomajra, Makhanmajra, Kishangarh and Manimajra. The area also includes the two natural rivulets of the Patiali Ki Rao and the Sukhna Choe. The city and the periphery were intended to have clearly defined functions as per the original plan and the Statute of the Land enunciated by Le Corbusier.

Describing Chandigarh Master Plan - 2031 as a vision for sustainable development, she explained the planning concept which is based on the principles of CIAM (Congress Internationaux d' Architecture Moderne) theories defining four major city-functions that is, Living, Working, Care of Body & Spirit, and Circulation. The plan is like human anatomy. Head is the Capitol Complex, Heart the City Centre, Sector 17, Lungs are the Leisure Valley, innumerable open spaces, and sector-greens, Intellect is the cultural and educational institutions, Circulatory System is the network of roads, 7Vs, and the Industrial Area is the viscera.

Chandigarh has hierarchical road network: V1-Fast roads connecting Chandigarh to other towns. V2-Arterial roads. V3-Fast vehicular roads around the sectors. V4-Meandering shopping streets. V5-Sector circulation roads. V6-Access roads to houses V7-Footpaths. V8-Cycle tracks. Buses to ply only on V1, V2, V3 and V4 roads.

Recommendations: The CMP 2031 expects a symbiotic relationship with the regional urban areas. The current Chandigarh Master Plan 2031 along with the GMADA Plan 2056 and the Haryana Development Plan should together arrive at a metropolitan

plan for the perspective year 2031 and a 'Public Transport Strategy'. Mrs. Sumit Kaur discussed a memorandum of understanding between Punjab, Haryana and Chandigarh for sharing key responsibilities for locating some of the spillover infrastructure components of Chandigarh in their territory in view of the land constraints.

She also discussed various important issues: Landuse, Traffic and Transportation, Effective Solid Waste Management, Heritage Preservation, Advertisement and signage control along regional roads, Slum free region /affordable housing, ensuring orderly /coordinated built environment /urban design at entry to city, and Disaster Management Plans.

Another important factor is the conversion of land use from industrial to commercial. Through this policy 659397 sq. meter area of new commercial area will eventually be added to the city. 70% converted plots opted for hotels / commercial office space for

business as such 9 new hotels have come up in the industrial area.

Phase I & II of an Information Technology (IT) Park, is having over an area of 123.43 acres and 228.49 acres respectively. The third phase of the IT Park was to be subsequently developed on 250 acres adjoining the Phase I and II. Exports to the tune of Rs. 700 crores with a manpower deployment of 10000 persons have already started from Phases I & II of the IT Park with companies like IBM, Wipro, Airtel, DLF, Infosys and Tech Mahindra already functioning from there.

Mrs. Sumit Kaur had a very elaborate presentation, and as citizens of Chandigarh it is of concern to us all. But due to time constraint, she had to cut it short. But it could not be before a vibrant interactive discussion between her and Rotarians. Hoping to see her soon again in our club, PP Pallav Mukherjee made the formal vote of thanks short and crisp.

A milestone for polio eradication in Nigeria



24th July 2015 marks one year since Nigeria last reported a polio case caused by wild poliovirus, putting the country on the brink of eradicating the paralyzing disease.

The last case was reported on 24 July 2014 in the northern state of Kano. If no cases are reported in the coming weeks, the World Health Organization is expected to remove Nigeria from the list of countries where polio is endemic, leaving just two: Afghanistan and Pakistan.

Nigeria is the last polio-endemic country in Africa. The continent is poised to reach its own first full year without any illness from the virus on 11 August.

"Every Rotarian in the world should be proud of this achievement," says Rotary International President K.R. Ravindran. "We made history. We have set Africa on course for a polio-free future. But we have not yet reached our goal of a polio-free world. Raising funds and awareness and advocating with your government are more crucial than ever."


