Rotary is Changing

Rotary is changing. In our regular meeting on May 20, 2016 PDG Shaju Peter gave a review of the Council on Legislation (CoL) held in Chicago on 10-15 April 2016. Shaju said, "One of the reasons why Rotary has survived for over 100 years is for the fact that we change with times." He explained that in other words, "CoL is the 'Parliament of Rotary' the objective being to

look into our rules and regulations which governs our organization, and change them if found necessary."

CoL takes place once in 3 years at Marriott Hotel in Chicago, which is a 5 days affair. In 2013 Shaju was the representative from our District, and this year it was PRID Yash Pal Das.

The Council is an assembly of one representative each from each Rotary District in the

world. There were 534 Districts in 2013 which dropped down to 529 in 2016. Shaju informed that every Rotary Club and every Rotary District of the world, and the RI board of directors have the liberty to propose to the Council an enactment or a resolution which results in hundreds of proposals from all over the world. The delegates from each district deliberate and act upon all proposed enactments and resolutions. Enactments seek to change Rotary's constitutional documents, and resolutions express an opinion or make a recommendation to the RI Board. Finally it comes to an electronic voting and majority decision changes the rule books.

The 2016 Council on Legislation may well be remembered as one of the most progressive in Rotary history. Shaju said, "This CoL has been absolutely revolutionary, and Rotary is changing." Not only did this Council grant clubs more freedom in determining their meeting schedule and membership, it also approved an increase in per capita dues of \$4 a year for three years. The increase will be used to enhance Rotary's website, improve online tools, and add programs and services to help clubs increase membership.

The Council is an essential element of Rotary's governance. Every three years, members from around the world gather in Chicago to consider proposed changes to the policies that govern the organization and its member clubs. Measures that are adopted take effect from 1 July.

The RI Board put forth two proposals that increase flexibility. The first measure allows clubs to decide to vary their meeting times, whether to meet online or in person, and when to cancel a meeting, as long as they meet at least twice a month. The second allows clubs flexibility in choosing their membership rules and requirements. Both passed.

Representatives also approved removing six membership criteria from the RI Constitution and replacing them with a simple requirement that a member be a person of good character who has a good reputation in their business or community and is willing to serve the community.

Shaju's informative presentation displayed the following decisions of CoL 2016;

- Admission Fees Abolished. No admission fee for new members.
- Clubs can decide their meeting frequency and attendance rules so long as they meet at least twice a month.
- If you have a baby you are exempt from attendance for a year.
- The 85 Rule is applicable only if a member has been a Rotarian for minimum 20 years.
- -The clubs will have the freedom to do away with the classification rules.
- Only Past Governors can contest election for membership in the Nominating Committee which selects RI Director.

- For a Challenge to be valid minimum 20% of the clubs should meet every year electronically. concur.
- RI Dues goes up by 4\$ every year for the next three years. The yearly per capita dues that clubs pay to RI will be \$60 in 2017-18, \$64 in 2018-19 and \$68 in 2019-20.
- CoL will deal with only Enactments. Council on Resolutions will

This is for our sanitory/toilet project for Govt. schools in and around Chandigarh. She said, "This was the result of the hard work put in by all of us, specially PDG Shaju Peter, Secretary Sanjay Bhatia and

The President pointed out that during our survey for the toilet project we came across Govt. Middle School in village Raipur Kalan. This school was in a pitiable condition having classes in the verandah and in the open or under the trees. Since Rotary India has special focus on Literacy we got permission from the DPI to construct two class rooms which was result of keen efforts of Rtn. Sanjay Bhatia, Rtn. Dr. Anureet Kaur, PP R.K. Luther, PP R.K. Goyal, VP Ashok Puri and PP Pallav Mukherjee.

This project will cost about Rs. 2.50 lakh for which donations came from President Kanan Diwan - Rs. 1,01,000/-, Secretary Sanjay Bhatia - Rs. 51,000/-, Rtn. Salil Chopra - 30 bags of cement and Dr. Indu Rastogi (of UK) - Rs. 22,000/-.

There is still a short fall of about Rs. 60000/- for which generous donors are requested to do the needful.

Rotary India Global Dream - Each One, Reach One and Teach One

President Nominee Rtn. Dr. Rita Kalra informed that Rotary India Global Dream, an initiative of Rotary India Literacy Mission (RILM), is committed to Total Literacy with a campaign of Each One, Reach One and Teach One. RILM intends to make the summer vacations fun for the children while engaging them in meaningful service to the society. Under this project there is a

simple process that involves a student to teach reading, writing and arithmetic to a non - literate adult for just 30 minutes a day, and in 45 - 60 days the adult becomes literate.

A toolkit consisting of just three books is the student's only requirement in the teaching process. This toolkit has been specially

designed in accordance with State guidelines, to ensure quick learning outcome for each adult and ease of use for the volunteer teacher.

With this pack, children of even 12 years of age can easily teach and persons between the ages of 14 to 75 years can learn with ease and at considerable speed. The ultimate goal will be to take each adult learner through the National Literacy Mission's Basic Literacy Examination in early August. The learner will then receive a certificate from the National Institute of Open Schools. All this is being done through an understanding with the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of
